Moot Court Exercise & Internship

Course Objective –

The term ‘moot’, according to Oxford and Chambers dictionary means, to propose for discussion; argue for practice; a matter about which there may be disagreement or uncertainty. The Course will help in developing fluency and clear assertion, and also gives one experience in the art of persuasion, and of putting a case concisely and intelligibly. The course not only gives one a picture of practice in court procedures but also helps to develop the self-confidence that every advocate should possess. This paper may have three components of 30 marks each and a viva for 10 marks.

(a) Moot Court (30 marks).

Every student may be required to do at least three moot courts in a year with 10 marks for each. The moot court work will be on assigned problem and it will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submissions and 5 marks for oral advocacy.

(b) Observance of Trial in two cases, one Civil and one Criminal (30 marks).

Students may be required to attend two trials in the course of the last two or three years of LL.B. studies. They will maintain a record and enter the various steps observed during their attendance on different days in the court assignment. This scheme will carry 30 marks.

(c) Interviewing techniques and Pre-trial preparations and Internship diary (30 marks).

Each student will observe two interviewing sessions of clients at the Lawyer's Office/ Legal Aid Office and record the proceedings in a diary, which will carry 15 marks. Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/petition. This will be recorded in the diary, which will carry 15 marks.

(d) The fourth component of this paper will be **Viva Voce examination** on all the above three aspects. This will carry **10 marks**.

Course Outcomes – After the completion of the course the students will be able to:

1. Enhance analytical as well as critical thinking of Students over interesting and contemporary legal issues,
2. Demonstrate a thorough and contextual knowledge of the various laws particularly in its application to real and hypothetical legal problems.
3. Acquire skill in advocacy, legal research and writing skills.
4. Gain interest in advocacy and competence as an advocate.
